

Boars Head Rock & Cahills Lookout

Cahills Lookout 100 metres one way, 5 minutes, few steps, easy.

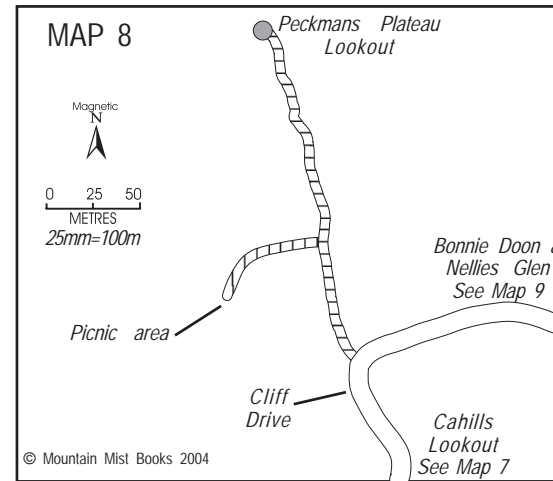
The best view of Boars Head Rock is found from O'Sullivan's Road on Narrow Neck, not this rough unformed track. But it's worth having a look. I've seen Red-tailed Black Cockatoos in the area.

The rather elaborate Cahills Lookout was built by Blue Mountains City Council in 1959. There are three platforms, the side ones giving different views. It was opened on June 6th 1959 by (and named after) John Joseph Cahill (1891–1959), Premier of NSW from 3rd April 1952 to 28th October 1959. The Cahill Expressway in Sydney also bears his name. I'd rather be remembered by a mountain lookout than a freeway!

Peckmans Plateau



Access: From Cliff Drive, 3km from Scenic World.

Features: Picnic area, Peckmans Plateau Lookout, views of Nellies Glen, one of the Bonnie Doon waterfalls, Megalong Valley and Mt Elphinstone at the end of Radiata Plateau to the northwest.

Length, Time & Rating: To lookout 180 metres one way, 5 minutes, *some steps, easy*. To picnic table 125 metres, *easy*.

Peckmans Plateau is a small plateau, roughly bounded by the Cliff Drive loop off Narrow Neck Road. The lookout is to one side of this area.
